



# FR. AZARIAH FRANCE-WILLIAMS



I have served as the Rector of Ascension Church Hulme for a little over five years, during which I have had the honour of observing and, in small ways, helping to shape your journey toward this significant milestone of ten years.

Growing up, I remember a call-and-response ritual in churches. The preacher would declare, "God is good," to which the congregation would reply, "All the time." The preacher would then affirm, "And all the time," and the congregation would respond, "God is good!"

This is the spirit I cherish within the diverse services and gatherings at Ascension. The statement "God is good" is vividly reflected in the people who meet monthly as part of the Luganda Fellowship, where they share and proclaim God's goodness through worship, word, and witness.

Personally, I have been blessed to notice how effectively the culture equips both clergy and laity to discover and develop their gifts.

Recently, during a confirmation service I participated in alongside the Bishop of Middleton, I was struck by the younger generation's remarkable ability to articulate and demonstrate a lived faith in all they do.

It is no surprise that many individuals are stepping into leadership roles within the Anglican Church when the culture is so empowering. Those

who do not seek church leadership still embody their Christian faith and values, serving as excellent stewards of their resources. Ascension leadership is particularly grateful for the number of PCC members who have joined us through the Luganda Fellowship. They share a commonality: each possesses compassionate intelligence, a can-do spirit, meticulous attention to detail, and the ability to work exceptionally well in teams.

I hesitate to single out individuals for praise, as I believe that collectively, you have created a powerful place of shelter that encompasses so many. Each one of you deserves recognition, and I would quickly run out of words if I attempted to name everyone.

As you contemplate the next ten years, what messages have you been receiving from God? As you continue to grow stronger, where will you focus your strength, and on whose behalf? What steps can you take to make space for underrepresented voices and choices? There is a significant amount of 'social action' which is pastoral; I believe this next era will emphasise 'social justice', which is prophetic. So let us say it together: "God is good..."




Dear Revd Enock

# The Day it all began

Sunday, 26th April 2015, stands as a historic and spirit-filled moment in the life of our community. It was on that day, within the walls of Ascension Church, Hulme, that a vision long held in many hearts finally came to life—a Luganda-speaking service in Manchester, rooted in faith, culture, and unity.

The idea for Okusinza e Manchester was jointly conceived by Omulangira Dickson Wasajja (RIP) and Omukungu Enock Kiyaga Mayanja. Recognising the absence of worship in our mother tongue and the deep spiritual and cultural need within the Ugandan diaspora, the two visionaries reached out. They formed a dedicated team of community members to bring this dream to reality. That founding team included:

Omubuulizi Isaac Jakira, Mrs. Pross Nankinga, Mr. Ssonko Lutaaya, Omukade Fredrick Kakaire,

Ms. Happy Ganzi, Mr. Milton Nume, Mr.Ronald Wampamba, Mrs. Betty JJjemba, Mr.Dennis Jjemba and Mr.Edward Kayemba.

Together, this group laid the foundation for a fellowship that would not only foster worship in Luganda but also encourage community cohesion and inspire the younger generation born in the UK to connect with their heritage.

The first service was a joyful and powerful occasion, led by **Venerable Danny Kajumba**, **Revd. Nathan Ntege**, **and the host priest**, **Revd. Canon Falak Sher.** It was the beginning of something sacred and lasting.

From the outset, the ministry was lay-led, with **Omubuulizi Isaac Jakira** taking on the role of spiritual leader. We give heartfelt thanks for his unwavering service and dedication, as he

continues to serve faithfully to this day. We also remain grateful for the many visiting clergy from the UK and Uganda who supported us, encouraged us, and helped sustain the service through the years.

Now, ten years on, we reflect with deep gratitude and joy. Month after month, on the last Sunday, we have gathered to:

- Worship God feeding the spirit
- Share knowledge and uplift one another feeding the mind
- Fellowship over a hot Ugandan meal (ekimere)
   feeding the body

It has always been our conviction that no one should ever leave God's house hungry, in any way. Today, as we mark a decade of God's faithfulness, we rejoice in how far we have come. We give thanks for the ordination of Revd. John Alex Muyita, the second minister to emerge from this fellowship, following in the footsteps of Revd. Enock Kiyaga Mayanja, ordained three years ago.

# THE STORY OF JOHN ALEX MUYITA

Born and raised in the heart of what is today known as Namutumba District in Uganda, John Alex Muyita's life has been shaped by faith, service, and a deep commitment to the well-being of others. From his earliest days, he showed signs of a servant heart—one that would go on to make a lasting impact across continents.

For over two decades, John has shared life's journey with his beloved wife, Dr. Annet Nakaganda Muyita. Their marriage is not only a testimony to enduring love but also a reflection of God's grace. Together, they have been blessed with four children—two daughters, namely Agnes and Beatrice and two sons, Elijah and Hosea, who form the heartbeat of their family.

John's life has been marked by consistent and generous voluntary service within the Anglican Church, both in Uganda and the United Kingdom. His contributions span a broad spectrum, including his service as a Lay Preacher, Leader of Prayer and Pastoral Care Teams, Synod Representative (Manchester Diocese), Chairperson of the Fathers' Union, and a counsellor offering spiritual, marital,

and youth guidance. He has played key roles in the strategic direction of church life, serving on Parish Councils (PCCs) and Programme Boards for Growing Faith, where his passion for Christian formation and intergenerational ministry has been evident.

John's dedication to faith is matched by his deep pursuit of education and social transformation. He holds a Master of Research in Educational Research with a special focus on Education and Social Justice from the University of Lancaster, UK, and a Master of Arts in Public Administration and Management from Makerere University in Kampala. His academic journey began with a Diploma in Secondary Education from Kyambogo University, laying a solid foundation for his lifelong vocation as an educator, followed by a Bachelor of Arts in Social Sciences.

Professionally, John is a seasoned educator and school leader, widely respected for his expertise in Economics and Entrepreneurship education. Beyond the classroom, he has contributed to curriculum development and the publication of learning materials, supporting the educational advancement of countless young people. His career has also included impactful roles in the NGO and charity sector, where he worked with influential organisations such as The AIDS Information Centre (AIC), World Vision International, and Hospice Africa.

Whether in Uganda or the UK, in churches, classrooms, boardrooms, or during pastoral visits, John Alex Muyita has remained a man of unwavering faith, wisdom, and service. ## Nnalongo Ritah Munyagwa's story (Obujulizi)

I told myself, 'I will not let anyone write my story; I will.' In 2015, I faced the most difficult time in my life. I had put my master's on hold not once but twice. The third time, I had to do it in three years, and I was paying my tuition. With three children all under 10, I had to persevere.

It was also during this time that we lost our fourth brother (The youngest of the twelve children, and who followed me). I was a walking time bomb. I lost myself. I never knew who I was anymore.

Sadly, due to various reasons, I graduated but without my pin to practice as a child protection social worker. This was painful. Life was tough. I had no energy left in me to appeal

this decision. I was exhausted.

I graduated a year after Okusinza mu Luganda e Manchester had started.

As I juggled through life, I decided to go back to university to pursue another third degree (BSC Nursing). There were no Master's at the time. As a single mother, I used to sit quietly in church every last Sunday of the month, most people never knew what I was going through as a person.

I had lost all I had worked hard for. I was broken and lost. I started my third degree in 2017. I graduated in 2020, during the COVID-19 pandemic.

I began my journey as a Nurse. I struggled with my student debts as well as taking care of my three children as a single mother. I was surviving by God's mercy. It's now ten years celebrating Okusinza mu Luganda e Manchester.

Over the past ten years, I have pursued another profession, and I am a mother to twins who are now twenty years old, as well as a twelve-year-old daughter. I am a married woman. I have gained lifetime friendships. I had been driving a second-hand car for all those years, but now I was the first person to drive my new Audi (2024).

I am a competent Cardiac ICU Nurse. I give God all the glory.

Well done to each and every one who has supported the Okusinza mu Luganda e Manchester. You can never go wrong when you serve the Almighty God.

In addition to my testimony, may you please include that I have survived COVID-19 three times. In addition, I exposed my little daughter to COVID-19 in 2020, and we ended up in the ICU. She was there for two weeks and had to learn to walk again, as COVID affects your bones. But we thank God almighty, she has now been discharged so far from all specialities (Rheumatology, Respiratory, cardiology, physiotherapy, ophthalmology, and just being monitored annually in the PIMS CLINIC)


When I look back now, I do so with deep gratitude for the blessings I have received, for the people who have walked alongside me, and for the faithful witness of this ministry over the past decade.

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
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
